| Proposal 18-1<br>A proposed initiated law to authorize and legalize possession, use and cultivation of marijuana products by individuals who are at least 21 years of age and older, and commercial sales of marijuana through state-licensed retailers  |                       |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Allow individuals 21 and older to purchase, possess and use marijuana and marijuana-infused edibles, and grow up to 12 marijuana plants for personal consumption.</li> <li>Impose a 10-ounce limit for marijuana kept at residences and require amounts over 2.5 ounces be secured in locked containers.</li> <li>Create a state licensing system for marijuana businesses and allow municipalities to ban or restrict them.</li> <li>Permit retail sales of marijuana and edibles subject to a 10% tax, dedicated to implementation costs, clinical trials, schools, roads, and municipalities where marijuana businesses are located.</li> <li>Change several current violations from crimes to civil infractions.</li> </ul> |                       |

| Proposal 18-2<br>A proposed constitutional amendment to establish a commission of citizens with exclusive authority to adopt district boundaries for the Michigan Senate, Michigan House of Representatives and U.S. Congress, every 10 years   |                       |
| This proposed constitutional amendment would:   |                       |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Create a commission of 13 registered voters randomly selected by the Secretary of State:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>4 each who self-identify as affiliated with the 2 major political parties; and</li> <li>5 who self-identify as unaffiliated with major political parties.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Prohibit partisan officeholders and candidates, their employees, certain relatives, and lobbyists from serving as commissioners.</li> <li>Establish new redistricting criteria including geographically compact and contiguous districts of equal population, reflecting Michigan's diverse population and communities of interest. Districts shall not provide disproportionate advantage to political parties or candidates.</li> <li>Require an appropriation of funds for commission operations and commissioner compensation.</li> </ul> |                       |
