

**CITY OF NILES
REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINIUTES
MONDAY, JANUARY 23, 2017**

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Nicholas Shelton in the City Council Chambers, 1345 East Main Street, Niles, Michigan at 6:00 p.m., January 23, 2017.

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION:

Jevin Weyenberg, Portage, MI stated that he was grateful that the Niles City Council has the foresight of looking into the Medical Marijuana Ordinance. He stated that he currently travels to Ann Arbor or Lansing to obtain medicine needed during his chemotherapy treatments. He encouraged the council to continue to move forward with the implementation of the Medical Marijuana Ordinance.

Michael Majerek, newly elected 12th District County Commissioner, introduced himself to the Niles City Council.

- He reported that the county is rehiring staff that left after the shooting of two bailiffs.
- Berrien County Animal Control is currently updating the Animal Control Ordinance. Written comments were requested to be sent to the county administrator prior to the final draft.
- Southwest Michigan Planning Commission (SWMPC) is currently working on countywide service plan.
- August 7, 2017 at 6:00pm the County Commissioner will be meeting at the South County Courthouse in Niles.

Gary Grathwohl stated that he received a parking ticket during the Hunter Ice Festival for parking on Front Street. He did not realize that parking is restricted. He requested that parking be allowed during festivals or change the hours of restricted parking to accommodate festival goers.

Lisa Croteau reported that downtown was full during the Hunter Ice Festival. Hunter ice cream was sold out and the book store was well attended. Ice sculptures didn't last long with above freezing temperatures.

RESOLVED BY: City Council, City of Niles, Michigan,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Act 51 of the Public Acts of 1951, as amended (Act 51), it is necessary for the City of Niles,

(hereby known as THE APPLICANT) established under Act 279, to provide a local transportation program for the state fiscal year of 2018 and, therefore, apply for state financial assistance under provisions of Act 51; and
WHEREAS, it is necessary for the governing body, to name an official representative for all public transportation matters, who is authorized to provide such information as deemed necessary by the State Transportation Commission or department for its administration of Act 51; and
WHEREAS, it is necessary to certify that no changes in eligibility documentation have occurred during the past state fiscal year; and
WHEREAS, the performance indicators have been reviewed and approved by the governing body, and
WHEREAS, THE APPLICANT, has reviewed and approved the proposed balanced (surplus) budget, and funding sources of estimated federal funds \$235,000, estimated state funds \$179,984, estimated local funds \$98,650, estimated fare box \$71,500, estimated other funds \$1,300, with total estimated expenses of \$553,103.
NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that THE APPLICANT hereby makes its intentions known to provide public transportation services and to apply for state financial assistance with this annual plan, in accordance with Act 51;
HEREBY, appoints Kelly Getman-Dissette as the Transportation Coordinator, for all public transportation matters, who is authorized to provide such information as deemed necessary by the State Transportation Commission or department for its administration of Act 51 for 2018.
